RESPONSE

I write in relation to the consolidating application for the extension of winning and working of limestone, importation of inert waste and restoration to amenity land at Graig Quarry and provide the following comments in relation to the local Highway Network.

The applicant has confirmed that the additional reserve of circa 5.4 million tonnes is to be exported in HGVs via the existing haul road and utilisation of the existing access to the A525/A543 roundabout through the Colomendy Industrial Estate. The continuation of exportation will be below the current output limit of 500,000 tonnes per annum.

As a result, there will be no significant change in terms of vehicular activity associated with the quarry when compared with the current and ongoing situation.

The proposals put forward represent a continuation of current activities as the proposed hours of operation, method of transport, main site access and types of vehicle used will not materially change.

As Highway Authority, we would have no objection to the proposals.
